

RULES AND REGULATIONS

UCI GRAN FONDO WORLD SERIES LA NUCÍA (ALICANTE - SPAIN) - 18 OCTOBER 2026 **La Nucía-La Nucía Long-Distance Race [132 km] Gorga-La Nucía Middle-Distance Race [71 km]** **Categories: UCI GFWS and OPEN**

1. GENERAL INFORMATION AND REGULATIONS

UCI GRAN FONDO WORLD SERIES LA NUCÍA (Alicante) – Spain (hereinafter, Gran Fondo La Nucía) is an international cycling race featured on the **UCI calendar**, taking the form of a one-day race. The event will feature:

- UCI GFWS Qualifier Category, counting towards and serving as a qualifier for the UCI Gran Fondo World Championships.
- Open category, which does not count as a qualifier for the UCI Gran Fondo World Series.

The race is governed by the “Reglamento de Ciclismo para Todos” (“Cycling-for-All Regulations”) of the *Real Federación Española de Ciclismo* (RFEC, Royal Spanish Cycling Federation) and is regulated in accordance with its current rules and regulations, which define this discipline as a cycling activity for leisure, recreation and sport, taking place on roads open to traffic under specific road safety regulations.

The race will be subject to Articles 15 *et seq.* of Annex II to Royal Decree 1428/2003 of 21 November, which approves the General Traffic Regulations, as well as to current traffic, vehicle movement and road safety laws and regulations.

In matters not covered by these Regulations, the current RFEC regulations will apply, more specifically "Title XV: Cycling for All" of the UCI Cycling Regulations, which can be viewed [here](#), and the UCI regulations, which can be viewed [here](#).

The cycling race will be held under a phased traffic closure scheme. Participants may use the road within the area marked out between the law enforcement officers and vehicles; the officers will indicate the start and end of the safety zone using red and green flags.

Under no circumstances must participants encroach on the carriageway for oncoming traffic.

The sections outside the safety zone will remain open to general traffic and participants must comply with applicable traffic regulations at all times.

All participants must also follow the instructions given by officers of the *Agrupación de Tráfico de la Guardia Civil* (ATGC, Civil Guard Traffic Unit), who will be responsible for setting and managing the timings and conditions of the interruptions to traffic.

1.2. Route, distances, start and finish and times

LONG DISTANCE

DISTANCE: 132 km (La Nucía – La Nucía)

START AND FINISH: *Estadio Olímpico Camilo Cano* (Camilo Cano Olympic Stadium), Camino de la Serreta, 03530 La Nucía (Alicante) – Spain.

START TIME: 08:30

ELEVATION GAIN: +2275 m

MIDDLE DISTANCE

DISTANCE: 71 km (Gorga – La Nucía)

START: *Rotonda de acceso a Gorga en la CV-754* (Roundabout at the entrance to Gorga on the CV-754), 03811 Gorga (Alicante) – Spain.

FINISH: *Estadio Olímpico Camilo Cano* (Camilo Cano Olympic Stadium), Camino de la Serreta, 03530 La Nucía (Alicante) – Spain.

START TIME: 11:00

ELEVATION GAIN: Ascent 1076 m | Descent 1393 m

UCI GRAN FONDO WORLD SERIES LA NUCÍA – UCI CATEGORY – Assignment of race distance

Participants registered in the UCI Category (qualifier for the 2027 World Championships) will be automatically assigned to the corresponding race distance based on their age group and sex.

The following will be assigned to the race starting in Gorga (Middle Distance):

- Men aged 60 or over
- Women aged 50 or over

The other participants in the UCI category will start in La Nucía (Long Distance).

In the UCI category, riders may not choose their own distance: The category and distance chosen when registering is final and will determine the participant's eligibility for UCI qualification.

INTERNATIONAL LONG DISTANCE LA NUCÍA – OPEN CATEGORY – Choice of race distance

Participants registered in the **Open Category** (non-qualifier UCI) **will be free to choose the distance** when registering.

STARTING ORDER, both in La Nucía and in Gorga

The starting order will be according to category and age group.

First off will be the UCI Category (GFWS Qualifier), with the start organised by age group from youngest to oldest in accordance with the regulations of the *Union Cycliste Internationale (UCI)*.

Within each age group, the organisers may determine the starting order according to technical, sporting or safety criteria.

The next off will be the participants registered in the Open Category (non-qualifier UCI).

Participants in the Open Category will not be allowed to start from the grid positions allocated to the UCI Category. The race number for the Open Category will be a different colour and will not carry UCI GFWS identification.

The organisers reserve the right to establish separate starting grid positions.

N.B.

The route will be clearly signposted and supervised by the organisers.

The schedule will be subject to the regulations in force at the time of the event and may be changed by the organisers; participants will be notified of any changes via the official channels in good time.

Refreshment stations

There will be various refreshment stations offering food and drink along the route. Their location will be announced on the website.

Checkpoint and cut-off time

A checkpoint will be set up in Gorga, where the race numbers of participants deemed to be **off the official route**, i.e. those who fail to reach that point within the maximum time limit set by the safety team, will be collected.

Participants who continue the race off the official route do so on public roads **open to traffic** entirely at their own risk, and must **comply with applicable traffic regulations at all times**.

1.3. Organisers

The event is organised by CLUB DEPORTIVO PODIUM, holder of tax number (CIF) ESG96074323. The organisers reserve the right to change these rules before the event, as well as to cancel or postpone it for reasons beyond their control. Any changes will be communicated in good time via the official channels.

1.4. Participation and categories

Participation:

Participation in the UCI GFWS Qualifier category is open to any cyclist who has reached the age of 19 by 31 December of the year in which the race takes place.

Participation in the OPEN category is open to any cyclist who has reached the age of 18 by the day of the race.

- As an exception, minors (aged between 15 and 17 on the day of the race) may take part in the OPEN category, provided they submit a signed authorisation from a parent or legal guardian (on the standard form), together with a photocopy of the national identity document (DNI) of the person signing the authorisation.

Categories:

1.4.1. UCI QUALIFIER CATEGORY (GFWS Qualifier – 2027 Gran Fondo World Championships)

Participants registered in the UCI Category (GFWS Qualifier) will be automatically assigned to the corresponding distance according to their age group and sex.

The top 25% finishers in each age group and sex will qualify for the corresponding UCI Gran Fondo World Championships.

Age groups (UCI category)

19-34
35-39
40-44
45-49
50-54
55-59
60-64
65-69
70-74
75-79

The following riders will compete in the middle-distance event:

- o Men aged 60 or over
- o Women aged 50 or over

Age groups will be determined according to the participant's age at 31 December of the year in which the event takes place, in accordance with the regulations of the *Union Cycliste Internationale (UCI)*.

Specific conditions:

- Mandatory assignment to the corresponding category according to age
- Separate qualification according to age group and sex

1.4.2. OPEN CATEGORY (NON-qualifier GFWS – 2027 Gran Fondo World Championships).

Participants registered in the Open category will take part **for participation's sake and will not be eligible** for:

- Qualification for the UCI Gran Fondo World Championships
- Official rankings in the UCI Gran Fondo World Series

Qualification: The Open Category will not have an official ranking by age group for the UCI. However, the organisation may draw up an unofficial internal general ranking.

IMPORTANT: The category (UCI Qualifier or Open) chosen at the time of registration will be final and will determine the participant's eligibility for the official rankings of the UCI Gran Fondo World Series.

1.5. Insurance

All participants must be insured and hold a valid federation licence issued for the current year by a cycling federation recognised by the UCI; it must include compulsory accident and third-party liability cover.

Only cycling licences issued by organisations affiliated to the *Union Cycliste Internationale* and valid in Spain will be accepted.

Anyone without a valid federation licence must take out the compulsory one-day insurance provided by the organisers for the day of the event; this insurance includes accident and third-party liability cover. To do so, they must indicate this during the registration process by selecting the "not federated" option.

Riders take part in the race at their own risk and responsibility.

The organisers recommend that all participants undergo a medical examination and/or treadmill test before the race to check for abnormalities or conditions that might prevent them from competing.

1.6. Race number, jersey, wristband and helmet

Article 1.6.1. Race number

All participants must wear the race numbers provided by the organisers without altering or modifying them in any way.

Any alteration to the race number, including cutting it down, trimming it, folding it or modifying it, will result in disqualification.

The rigid race number or plate must be attached to the front of the handlebars in a visible position and not rolled up.

Collection of race numbers and rider packs:

Race numbers and rider packs can be collected from the event facilities between 16:00 and 21:00 pm on Saturday, 17 October 2026. In exceptional cases, they may be collected on the day of the race between 07:30 and 08.10.

All participants are advised to collect their race number and rider pack on Saturday, 17 October 2026.

The facilities area will be located next to the start and finish line in the car park of the Camilo Cano Olympic Stadium in La Nucía.

To collect their race number and rider pack, participants must show a valid form of identification (national identity document (DNI), passport or other document valid in their country of origin) together with their registration confirmation. Members of a cycling federation must also show their cycling licence.

Any changes and/or modifications will be announced on the official website at www.granfondolanucia.com

Race numbers are personal and non-transferable; participants are strictly prohibited from taking part in the event without a race number and an identification wristband.

Article 1.6.2. Jersey, wristband and helmet.

Jersey: The organisers will give participants who have registered via the official procedure an official jersey.

o The **official jersey must be worn** during the event, **but only in the OPEN category**.

Wristband: Participants will be given an identification wristband, which **MUST BE WORN** at all times during the event. Participants must wear it at all times, as this wristband grants access to the various event facilities: refreshment stations, breakdown service and other services provided by the organisers' volunteers.

Helmet: The **use** of an approved safety helmet is **MANDATORY** for all participants. Failure to comply with this rule will result in disqualification from the event.

IMPORTANT:

- On the day of the race, all participants must wear their race number with the timing chip in a clearly visible position. Any participant who does not wear their race number in a visible and correct manner will be removed from the course by members of the organisation or by law enforcement officers.
- At the entrance to the start area, finish line or restricted areas, riders must wear the accreditation wristband provided in their rider pack. **The wristband is personal and non-transferable**, and will be fitted by the organisers in such a way that it cannot be removed. If a participant breaks, cuts or tampers with the wristband, they will not be allowed to take part in the event and will not be issued with a replacement; security staff will check wristbands at the event entrances. At the entrance to the start area, officials will check that race numbers, timing chips and competition equipment are correctly in place; anyone failing to comply with these rules may be prevented from taking part.
- When collecting their race number, participants will be responsible for checking that all items purchased in addition to the entry fee (such as VIP wristbands, merchandise, etc.) are correctly included in their rider pack. No claims will be accepted once they have left the registration area.
- The race number and rider pack may be collected by a third party other than the participant provided that they show a duly completed and signed authorisation form, together with a copy of the participant's identity document.

1.7. Right of admission

The organisers reserve the right to prevent participants from starting the race or to exclude them before or during the event if they have been sanctioned for doping by the UCI, any other national federation or the relevant competent bodies.

Participants who find themselves in these circumstances and are excluded will forfeit all rights associated with their registration.

The organisers reserve the right to refuse entry to the event. The organisers also reserve the right to expel participants who act in breach of these regulations, fail to follow the instructions of the organisation staff or who behave in a manner that is inappropriate, dangerous, unsportsmanlike or likely to damage the reputation of the event.

Likewise, the organisers may refuse participation in the race to any cyclists who have exhibited similar behaviour at other competitions.

1.8. Security measures

Throughout the event, the organisers will provide a team of professional medical and healthcare staff, comprising doctors, healthcare workers and ambulance crews, as well as liaison motorbikes and signs along the route. For the participants' own safety, it is **MANDATORY** to carry official identification (national identity document (DNI), passport or other document valid in their country of origin) in their cycling jersey, as well as a mobile phone with a fully charged battery.

VERY IMPORTANT:

- All participants must race **within the designated area**, i.e. between the ATGC (Civil Guard Traffic Unit) officers who mark the start and end of the area closed to traffic. **The start is signalled by the red flag and the finish by the green flag.**
- No participant may go beyond the red flag.
- During the race, **anyone who is unable to keep up with the pace set and is overtaken by the green flag will be out of the race**; they must therefore **slow down and ride with caution, without obstructing other road users, while complying with traffic regulations and signs.**

All participants are advised:

- The event is an international cycle race.
- **To keep to the right** and not encroach on the carriageway for oncoming traffic.
- Most of the route follows minor roads with no hard shoulder, so extreme care must be taken.
- The mountain passes feature long descents with dangerous bends, so extreme caution is required on these sections.
- The routes are signposted by the organisers.
- Do not throw anything on the ground; please use the bins and waste bins provided at the refreshment stations. Keep items in your pocket during the route until you reach the refreshment station or the finish line. **Look after, protect and respect nature and the environment.**
- **All participants who drop out of the race must remember that they are riding on public roads open to traffic and must obey all traffic regulations and signs, just like any other road user.**
- Riders must comply with the instructions of the officers of the Civil Guard Traffic Unit at all times.

1.9. Traffic regulations

Participants racing between the red flag and the green flag will be travelling on roads closed to traffic; however, 100% of the route of the race is NOT closed to traffic. All participants must strictly comply with the provisions of the Law on Traffic, Motor Vehicle Circulation and Road Safety, as well as General Traffic Regulations. They must also follow instructions given by the Civil Guard, the Local Police and the event organisers at all times. Anyone failing to comply with instructions given by law enforcement officers will be removed from the race. By accepting these regulations, all participants agree to comply with the rules set out herein and to ensure their own safety and that of other participants and road users.

By registering for the race, participants acknowledge that they accept the risks inherent to taking part in an event open to traffic and release the event organisers from all and any liability for any incident or accident arising from their participation.

It is strictly forbidden for anyone not registered for the Gran Fondo La Nucía to enter the Start/Finish area.

1.10. Breakdown service and sweeper bus.

Breakdown service:

The organisers will provide a breakdown service during the event. In case of a breakdown, labour will be free of charge, but participants will be responsible for the cost of spare parts. Only repairs that can be carried out on the road will be undertaken, except for punctures.

Sweeper bus:

The organisers will provide a sweeper bus as a courtesy service; however, its use will not be compulsory in the event of withdrawal. Any participant who chooses to use it does so of their own free will and will be responsible for the safekeeping of their bicycle and personal belongings. Neither the bus company nor the organisers may be held liable for any damage caused to the participant's bicycle or personal belongings.

1.11. Accompanying persons' cars.

Vehicles not authorised by the organisers are prohibited from accompanying the race. The organisation's vehicles will display a sign with a specific format and clearly identified in a visible part of the vehicle.

2. QUALIFICATIONS AND PRIZES

2.1. UCI QUALIFIER CATEGORY (GFWS Qualifier – 2027 Gran Fondo World Championships)

The UCI Gran Fondo World Series La Nucía is a qualifier event for the 2027 UCI Gran Fondo World Championships. Based on the results of each race, the top 25% cyclists in each age group will qualify for said championships. This 25% will be calculated based on the number of participants starting in each age group, rather than the number of cyclists who complete the race.

The top three male and female riders in each age group will also qualify directly for the UCI Gran Fondo World Championships, regardless of the number of participants starting in that group. To qualify, riders must complete the race.

Participants who have qualified for the UCI Gran Fondo World Championships will be listed on the UCI's official website and will receive an email from the UCI itself, inviting them to take part and to complete their registration directly on the UCI's website.

PRIZES:

A **finisher's medal** will be awarded to each participant when they cross the finish line. The item will not be sent by post at a later date.

Every rider who finishes in the **top 25% of qualified riders** in their respective age group [based on the number of riders who started the race] will receive a **UCI medal** certifying their qualification. The medal will be presented in the marquee set up for this purpose as the results are officially confirmed.

The top three finishers in both the men's and women's categories for each distance (Long Distance and Middle Distance), as per the overall results, must attend the official trophy ceremony to collect their prizes and, where applicable, the corresponding gifts. Trophies and prizes not collected during the ceremony will not be sent by post at a later date.

2.2. OPEN CATEGORY (Non-qualifier UCI)

Participants registered in the OPEN category will not feature in the official rankings of the UCI Gran Fondo World Series.

PRIZES:

A **finisher's medal** will be awarded to each participant when they cross the finish line. The item will not be sent by post at a later date.

The top three finishers in both the men's and women's categories for each distance (Long Distance and Middle Distance), as per the overall results, must attend the official trophy ceremony to collect their prizes and, where applicable, the corresponding gifts. Trophies and prizes not collected during the ceremony will not be sent by post at a later date.

2.3. – SPECIAL PRIZE IN KIND: "CLIMB TIME TRIAL RECORD - COLL DE RATES "

The Organisers are offering a special prize in kind, with an estimated maximum value of THREE THOUSAND EUROS (€3,000), for the participant who, during the event, beats the record time set in the official Coll de Rates time trial, currently standing at 11 minutes and 57 seconds (11'57") and recorded by Tadej Pogačar.

The prize is subject to full compliance with the following mandatory requirements:

1. The prize will be awarded exclusively for the official Coll de Rates climb time trial; no other split times, alternative sections or records from personal devices will be accepted.
2. Only participants who complete the entire official race and cross the finish line within the official time limits set in accordance with UCI regulations and the specific rules of the event will be eligible for the prize.
3. The prize will be awarded exclusively to the participant who records the fastest valid time in the time trial. If more than one participant beats the record time, the prize will be awarded exclusively to the participant with the best time; the prize cannot be shared or exchanged for cash or any other form of financial compensation.
4. The only time that will be considered valid for the prize will be that recorded by the event's official timing system, which has been duly approved and validated by the Organisers.
5. The organisers expressly reserve the right to verify, inspect, validate and, where appropriate, invalidate results, as well as to declare the prize void should technical, sporting, regulatory, disciplinary or *force majeure* circumstances arise, without this giving rise to any right to claim.
6. The participant who wins the prize must not be subject to any sanction, suspension or disqualification for doping-related offences under the regulations of the UCI, the RFEC, the World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) or any other competent authority. The Organisers may also revoke the award of the prize if there are reasonable grounds for suspicion, ongoing proceedings or adverse analytical findings pending with regard to possible anti-doping violations.
7. The Organisers may make the final confirmation and award of the prize subject to any anti-doping tests, checks or procedures it deems appropriate. If a participant refuses to undergo such tests or checks, they will automatically forfeit their right to the prize.

Nature and taxation of the prize (residents and non-residents)

The prize will be in kind; there is no cash prize, and it is awarded as part of a cycling event organised in accordance with applicable regulations.

The prize will have an estimated maximum value of THREE THOUSAND EUROS (€3,000), which is to be understood as a gross amount and as the total financial limit of the prize. Where applicable, this limit includes the cost of the advance payment or legally required tax deduction, such that the value of the non-cash prize awarded to the winner will be the amount remaining after deducting the applicable tax liability from this limit.

For tax purposes, the prize in kind will be treated as a capital gain and will be subject to taxation in accordance with current Spanish tax legislation, both for participants who are tax residents in Spain and for non-residents; where applicable, it will be subject to personal income tax (IRPF) or non-resident income tax (IRNR).

Under no circumstances will the winner receive any advance payment of the prize or any sum of money in connection with it.

Where applicable and where legally required, the organisers will make the relevant payment on account to the tax authorities, with no financial impact on the winner and without this giving rise to any entitlement to payment.

The prize cannot be substituted, exchanged or redeemed for cash.

The actual award of the prize will be subject to the winner providing the required tax and administrative documentation in due time and in the prescribed manner, including, where applicable, proof of their tax residence.

Acceptance clause

Participation in the race implies full and express acceptance of this clause, as well as a waiver of any claim arising from the nature, valuation, award or presentation of the prize.

3. REGISTRATIONS AND TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF PARTICIPATION

3.1. Registrations

Registrations will take place via the event's official website at www.granfondolanucia.com

No registrations will be accepted on the day of the event.

Registration for the event is personal and non-transferable, except in the cases expressly provided for in these rules and regulations.

By completing the registration process, participants acknowledge that they have read and fully accept these regulations, as well as the rules and conditions set out by the organisers.

The organisers may publish the list of registered participants in the UCI Qualifier Category (GFWS) via the event's official channels.

3.2. Changes of race number

Participants will be allowed to transfer their race number to another participant until 1 September 2026.

Changes will incur an administration fee of €10, to which the following may be added, where applicable:

- The difference between the amount originally paid and the price applicable at the time of the change.
- The fee for one day's compulsory insurance when the new participant does not hold a valid federation licence with cover in Spain.

Requests for changes must be made in accordance with the procedure established by the organisers before the specified deadline.

The organisers reserve the right to reject applications that are incomplete, incorrect or submitted after the deadline.

3.3. Transfer to the 2027 edition

Participants may apply for their registration to be transferred to the 2027 edition of the event until 30 September 2026, subject to payment of an administration fee of €35.

No changes to subsequent editions or requests submitted after the deadline will be accepted.

The participant expressly agrees that:

- The date of the 2027 event may not have been confirmed when the change is requested.
- Once the transfer has been made, no further changes, cancellations or refunds will be accepted.
- The transferred registration will be subject to the terms and conditions in force for the event in question.
- In the event of the definitive cancellation of the target event, neither the registration fee nor the administration fee will be refunded.

3.4. Cancellation, changes and refund policy

Once the registration has been confirmed and accepted, the fee paid is non-refundable.

Registration is personal and non-refundable. If a participant is unable to take part, they may only:

- Request a transfer of their race number to another participant in accordance with the conditions and deadlines set out in Article 3.2.
- Request the transfer of their registration to the 2027 edition of the event in accordance with the conditions set out in Article 3.3.

Apart from these cases, no refund will be given, regardless of the reason for not taking part.

If a participant does not take part, they will not be entitled to receive the items included in the rider pack, nor will said items be sent by post at a later date.

3.5. Permitted changes to the registration

Participants may change certain services or details relating to their registration, such as jersey size, additional services or extras booked, within the deadlines set by the organisers.

Approved changes and their deadlines will be published and updated, where necessary, on the official website of the event.

These changes must be made using the registration reference number provided by email after completing the registration process.

3.6. Personalised finisher's medal

The organisers will offer participants the chance to personalise their official finisher's medal by having their name and official race time engraved on it.

- Cost during the registration process: €5.
- Cost of requests after completing the race: €10

The availability of this service will be subject to the terms and conditions set by the organisers.

3.7. Suspension, modifications and *force majeure*

The organisers reserve the right to change the route, timings, refreshment stations, services or any other aspect of the event when there are valid reasons for doing so.

The organisers may also suspend, postpone or cancel all or part of the event for reasons beyond their control, including safety concerns, directives from the relevant authorities, adverse weather conditions or cases of *force majeure*, such as pandemics, health emergencies or similar.

Any changes to the route or the conditions under which the event is held will not entitle participants to a refund of their registration fee.

In the event of suspension or cancellation once the event has begun, no refund of the registration fee will be given.

Where circumstances so allow, the organisers may offer alternative routes, changes to the event format, or a postponement to a later date.

3.8. Right of admission

The provisions of Article 1.7 of these regulations will apply in relation to the right of admission, exclusion and participation in the event.

4. LEGAL PROVISIONS

4.1. Legal provisions

C.D. Podium hereby states that it is not a member of the Consumer Arbitration Scheme, where it reserves the right to participate in said scheme depending on the circumstances of each individual case.

In accordance with Article 14.1 of Regulation (EU) No. 524/2013, the European Commission provides an online dispute resolution platform at <https://ec.europa.eu/consumers/odr/main>

4.2. Disclaimer

The organisers decline all liability for any accidents in which a participant may be either the cause or the victim; participants must be covered by the relevant federation licence or, failing that, by accident insurance taken out through the organisers.

The organisers also decline all liability for any expenses, debts, losses, theft, damage or breakdowns that may be incurred in relation to participants' bicycles, equipment or personal belongings during the event.

Each participant takes part in the race at their own risk and expressly releases the organisers from any liability arising from such circumstances.

4.3. Amendments, suspension and *force majeure*

The organisers may take the measures set out in Article 3.7 of these regulations in relation to changes to the route, times, services or the suspension, postponement or cancellation of the event for justified reasons or in cases of *force majeure*.

4.4. Acceptance of the Rules

By completing the registration process, participants confirm that they have read and fully accept these rules and regulations and expressly waive any legal action against the organisers arising from their participation in the event, except where such liability cannot be legally excluded.

4.5. Image rights

By accepting these rules, participants authorise the organisers to record all or part of their participation in the event, and to use their image in photographs, videos and other audiovisual media for promotional, advertising and publicity purposes relating to the Gran Fondo La Nucía in any media and format (press, radio, television, the internet, social media, posters, publications, etc.).

This authorisation is granted free of charge and is valid indefinitely.

In the case of minors, this authorisation will be deemed to have been granted by their parents, guardians or legal representatives.

4.6. Data protection
